Welcome.

In the spring of 2014, we weren't ready for the New Room Conference, but the Lord seemed to "have need of it." Full of faith, with no idea what we were getting into, and a little under six months lead time, we made ready. It began with a prayer meeting on that next Wednesday. Our prayer, inspired by the deep longing for God in Psalm 42, was singular— "Jesus, would you meet with us?"

On September 18, 2014, the second day of that first conference, at around 10:40 a.m., in the midst of one of the keynote presentations, the Holy Spirit seized the agenda. And we have never gotten it back. As Jesus revealed himself and his purposes, men and women began to give themselves unreservedly, with an uncommon abandon, to him alone.

The small fires of great awakening were lit. And everywhere that happens, from the Day of Pentecost forward, a door opens into a new room for the ever-expanding kingdom of heaven on earth.

Every Wednesday since that first Wednesday more than seven years ago, our prayer has remained the same, "Jesus, would you meet with us?" At that first prayer meeting, months before the first gathering, a door into a New Room was opened and it has never closed. We don't think of the New Room as a three-day event in September. It is a place, an "on-earth-as-it-is-in-heaven" space we share and hold between us—holy ground—an ongoing, unceasing, ever-surprising meeting with God.

As the global pandemic and all its disruption and death has met up with the already churning forces of darkness and polarizing chaos all over the world, we discern the awakening activity of Jesus like never before. At the point where we seem to be the most tired and beleaguered and hard pressed on every side, we sense the readiness of the Holy Spirit to move like never before in our lifetimes. We sense a new door has opened and we are praying this New Room Conference will be the opportunity to walk through it into thousands of new rooms all over the world.

Let's be clear. All of this is for awakening. The measure of a meeting with God is not so much what happens in the meeting, but where the meeting goes next. New Room is not interested in becoming a bigger and bigger conference, or even a "movement" for that matter. We are praying for the launch of many movements—through you—through banded hearts, bonded homes, apostolic churches, and awakened cities.

A Great Awakening is the messy confluence of many people moving not in organizational coordination but in a divine concertedness, banding, praying, sowing, and reaping. It's not about an association or a denomination or a conference but a transcendent fellowship of travailing love, existing in the courts of heaven and moved on earth by the unseen hand of God, to do impossible things in unimaginable ways.



The Door Is Open




KIS OPEN

DOORS WIDE OPEN



HOW DO WE GET WELL?




Topic







THE HEART OF THE FATHER IN THE HEARTS OF HIS PEOPLE


The awakening was only three years old when Wesley distilled its defining mark, in "The Character of a Methodist," down to Romans 5:5: "A Methodist is one who has 'the love of God shed abroad in his heart by the Holy Ghost given unto him." All we've been through and what we've shared today adds force to our recognition of how deeply we need this love in every level of life. Tonight we open our hearts again to the gift of the Father's heart, offered in abundance by his Spirit.

- 2. Is there anything causing resistance to receiving? Could you bring that to him?
- 3. How would assurance in your standing as daughter or son of the Father change the way you sow for awakening?



The Awakening Calendar



The Word of God (a.k.a. the Bible) by which we know the Word (a.k.a. Jesus) is the single most important timetelling device in the history of history and in the future of eternity. The map represents the life of Jesus Christ laid out in a linear movemental fashion. It coheres around three epic journeys: Advent through Epiphany (darkness to light); Lent through Eastertide (death to life); and Pentecost through Kingdomtide: (brokenness to wholeness).

It begins at the highest summit where we gaze upon the horizon and behold the second Advent (coming) of Jesus. From there we embark on a descent, leading us to shepherds, angels, and a baby in a manger—Christmas. After twelve days we enter Epiphany, and ascend until we reach the Mount of Transfiguration. Journey two is the descent of all descents as we follow Jesus through forty days of Lent all the way down to the cross and the surprise of all surprises: the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday. Here begins an ascent called Eastertide. On the fortieth day Jesus ascends to the right hand of God, and ten days later we gather on Pentecost to receive the Holy Spirit.

The third journey leads down into the valley of vision where we follow Jesus into his kingdom of "on earth as it is in heaven," and then leads to the movement we call Kingdomtide, back up to the summit where we again gaze upon the far Advent horizon to behold his coming again.

This map sketch is meant to convey the reality that time is not a neverending cyclical process but the movement of God with us. Though there be a beginning, middle, and end, this is the world without end.

John Wesley once famously said, "There is no holiness apart from social holiness." Over the years, many have mistakenly asserted that he was talking about social justice.


